Faith - What does God offer us?

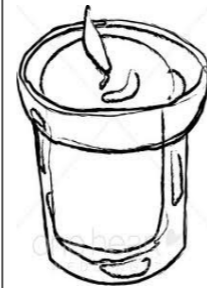
