Praying for our dead in November

The Christian community since the earliest times has accompanied people in the face of the dead of loved ones. The funeral rites are acts of public worship at which a number of elements are involved - God is praised; the Resurrection of Jesus is proclaimed conveying the hope of being gathered together again in 5 God's kingdom; prayers are offered for the



soul of the deceased person; their body is honoured and the bereaved are consoled.

Faithful to these elements and, in the context of this month of prayer for the dead, the Church has recently reissued a reminder of some principles relating to the funeral rites. This does not change the current practice in Ireland where the burial of the body of the deceased or its cremation are both the prevailing practice. Rather:

- · it restates the Church's preference for the burial of the body of the deceased;
- · it underlines reasons for the preference of the burial of the
- · it sets out new norms pertaining to the conservation of ashes following cremation.

The ashes of the faithful departed should be buried in a cemetery or reposed in a columbarium. The norms state that it is not permitted to scatter the ashes of the faithful departed in the air, on land, at sea or in some other way, nor may they be preserved in mementos, pieces of jewellery or other objects. It also prohibits the division of ashes amongst family members.

After the death of a relative, friend or neighbour, it has been customary to send a Mass card to the bereaved. This expression of sympathy confirms that an individual Mass will be offered by an individual priest for the soul of the deceased. Canon law prohibits any abuse of this practice and explicitly states that "appearance of trafficking or trading is to be excluded entirely from the offering for Masses (can. 947).



The annual **Bereavement Mass** in the Cathedral on Tuesday 15th November at 7.30pm, will be offered in memory of those whose funerals took place in the parish during the past year.
