**Excerpt from words of Bishop Frank Caggiano,** auxiliary bishop of the diocese of Brooklyn, USA, during the Eucharistic Congress

"To begin our reflection, I wish to share with you a brief story in my own life that demonstrates the power that a single word can have. The year was 1982 and I found myself working as a sales representative for one of the world's largest media companies. It was a Friday morning and I was filled with joy because I had been accepted into the seminary earlier that week to begin my studies for the priesthood. The only task remaining was to tell my clients that I was leaving. I began by sharing my news with my most important client. She was a person who often did not pay me much attention, since I was "only a salesman". On this particular morning, as we were walking through the hall of her school, I finally had the opportunity to tell her of my decision to leave. She immediately stopped, glanced towards me and laughed. She said: "I knew you could not succeed in this job. Who would hire you?" My response was a single word—Jesus. Her reaction was both immediate and unexpected. Her face turned ashen white, her lips began to tremble, she asked me into her office and for the first time spoke to me face to face. She opened her heart and shared the many burdens of her life with me. On that day, I understood the power of a word, not just any word but the one word, Jesus! My friends, I share this story with you because we are here today, what you and I are celebrating, is far greater than any word you or I can ever speak. Rather, what calls us together is the living Word of God."
