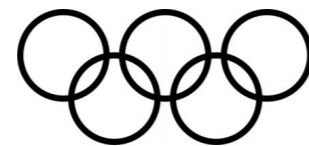

Meath Diocesan Pilgrimage to Knock - Today

The Annual Diocesan Pilgrimage to Knock coincides with the opening of the Novena in Knock and will take place next today. Bishop Michael Smith will lead ceremonies at 2.30pm in the Basilica with the Sacrament of the Sick, followed by Mass, Benediction and the Rosary Procession. Fr Luke will lead our parish group on pilgrimage to Knock today.



Local Olympics Hero – well done to David Oliver Joyce who represented our locality and the country with pride and dignity this week at his first Olympics. We wish him and his family all the very best.

Catholic athletes at Olympics share their faith - Simone Biles and Katie Ledecky are two of the names to watch at the Olympic games in Rio.

Simone Biles is a record-shattering US gymnast. She says her strong family and faith life carries with her to success. She attends Sunday Mass with her parents and lights a candle to St. Sebastian, the patron saint of athletes, before big events. She has already won 2 gold medals in these Olympic games.

Katie Ledecky is a 19 year-old swimmer and two-time Olympic gold medalist. "My Catholic faith is very important to me" she says. "It always has been and it always will be. It is part of who I am and I feel comfortable practicing my faith. It helps me put things in perspective." After winning her first Olympic gold 4 years ago, she paid a visit to the convent of the sisters from her primary school. She wanted to thank the sisters for their support over the years and give them a chance to celebrate with her. Katie has so far won 3 gold medals and 1 silver in these Olympic games.

6 Steps to Living Faith (by Cardinal Stefan Wyszyński)

1. Respect everyone—Christ resides in everyone. Be sensitive to others—they are your brothers and sisters.
2. Think well of everyone - speak ill of no one. Try to find something good even in the worst circumstances.
3. Act always to your neighbour's advantage. Do good things to others, as you would like them done to you. Never give a thought to what others owe you, but always to what you owe them.
4. Work conscientiously - others benefit from the fruits of your labour, just as you benefit from the labour of others.
5. Be active in your community. Be open to the poor and the sick. Share your goods. Try to see the needs of those around you.
6. Pray for everyone, even your enemies.

On this day..... 14th August 1941

The scene was grim in Auschwitz when 10 prisoners had been recaptured after trying to escape the Nazi concentration camp in Poland. Each prisoner was to be sentenced to death by starvation. Feeling compassion, a local priest Fr Maximilian Kolbe stepped forward and volunteered to die in place of one of them. Kolbe was later killed by lethal injection on this day 75 years ago. He was canonised by St John Paul in 1982 and Pope Francis visited his prison cell in Auschwitz last month. Today is his feast day.
