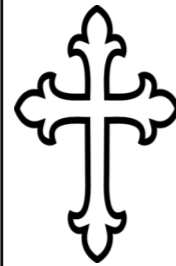

Visit of Relic of St Teresa of Calcutta

A RELIC of St Teresa of Calcutta will visit the Cathedral on 26th July as part of a tour of veneration across Ireland. The relic – a muslin cloth marked with the blood of the saint and encased in a cross – The tour was organised by the Knights of Columbanus, who have been loaned the relic by the Mother Teresa Centre of the Missionaries of Charity. Born in 1910 in Skopje, Macedonia, Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu - who would later become known as Mother Teresa - moved to Ireland at the age of 18 and joined the Loreto Order. In 1929 she moved to India to work with the poor, before founding the Missionaries of Charity order in 1950, which by 2012 had 4,500 sisters working in 133 countries. Mother Teresa died in September 1997 and was canonised in September 2016, becoming St Teresa of Calcutta.
