Feast of Christ the King

Pope Pius XI established the Feast of Christ the King when he published his encyclical "Quas primas" on 11 December 1925 - almost 90 years ago. The Feast and the encyclical were in response to the growing violence and nationalism which, in time, led to the horrors of Nazism and Stalinism.

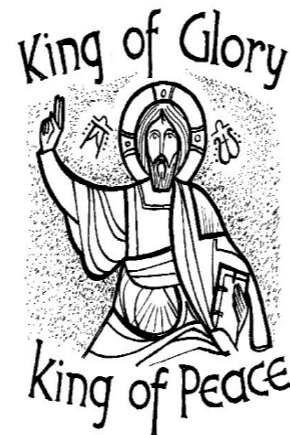
Pius XI wanted to offer to the world the vision of the Kingdom of God, where Christ is King, as an alternative to hatred and bloodshed. In many ways, our present experience in Europe makes the Feast and encyclical very resonant. It was Pope Pius XI who named our Cathedral under the patronage of Christ the King. It is hoped that the Cathedral's presence in our town will keep before us the image of God's Kingdom.

We take this opportunity to thank all who give generously of their talents and time to maintain the beauty of the Cathedral and to preserve the rich heritage that has been entrusted to our care and, most of all, to our parishioners who join us here in prayer.
