Visit of Relic of St Teresa of Calcutta

A relic of St Teresa of Calcutta will arrive
in the Cathedral at 7.30pm on Wednesday.

- Veneration of the relic will begin after Mass until 9.45pm, concluding with Night Prayer

Thursday 27th July

- Mass at 7.45am & 10am
- Veneration of the relic after 7.45am & 10am Mass
- The relic will depart at 2pm

The visit of the relic is organised by the **Knights of St Columbanus**; an Order of Catholic laymen dedicated to the service of Christ in daily life, in the workplace, the marketplace, in City, Urban and Provincial areas.

They welcome Catholic men, in full communion with the Church, who wish to bring to the service of Christ their talents and skills towards the promotion of Christian values and principles in Society, for the greater Honour and Glory of God the Father.

Emergency Trócaire Appeal takes place this weekend in parishes throughout Ireland because over 24 million people across East Africa in Somalia, South Sudan, Kenya and Ethiopia, are struggling to survive a devastating hunger crisis.

We welcome **Eamon Meehan**, Executive Director of Trócaire, who will speak at Masses in the Cathedral and **Eamon Sharkey** will speak in St Paul's.

The two most severely affected areas of **Kenya** are **Kitui** (east of Nairobi) and **Turkana** (north-east Kenya bordering Somalia).

The first Bishop of Kitui was Bishop William Dunne of Delvin and the first Bishop of Lodwar (Turkana) was Bishop John Mahon of Killeigh-Tullamore. Kiltegan priests ministered in both dioceses. Irish Loreto Sisters are present in South Sudan.

In the past year Mullingar parishioners have contributed over €65,000 to Trócaire, this includes €25,260 during Lent.
