Highlights of Mullingar Parish Programme for Lent

4-5 March 24 hour vigil of prayer in the Cathedral

6 March Sharing in the work of Trócaire

7 March Parish Lenten Talk on the theme of Mercy.

The Cathedral parish in Mullingar has unveiled a programme of prayer and reflection to help parishioners grow in faith during the season of Lent.



The programme will run over the weekend of 4 – 7 March 2016. The Cathedral will host a non-stop 24-hour vigil of prayer, beginning on Friday 4 March at 10am. This vigil, which will see people praying in the Cathedral during the night, will provide opportunities for confessions, Eucharistic Adoration, the celebration of the Eucharist, as well as guided prayer for vocations, young people, the sick and the Pope's intentions.

"The parish clergy and a team of lay leaders will welcome and minister to those who join us for this event during the day and throughout the night. Any parishioners in the Mullingar area or further afield who would like to take part in facilitating this event are welcome to contact the Cathedral office." The vigil will end with Mass on Saturday 5 March at 10am in the Cathedral.

The following day, Sunday 6 March, will see a focus on promoting the work of Trócaire in responding to those who are most in need throughout the world. *"A vigil of prayer should lead us to some form of active engagement in the practical work of the Gospel. Helping Trócaire to help others is one sure way to follow the example of the Good Samaritan during the 40 days of Lent."*

"We reflect on the well-known story of the Good Samaritan that is told to us in the Gospel of St Luke" focusing on this theme we have organised a Parish Lenten Talk, "We have invited Fr Kevin O'Gorman, a lecturer in Maynooth College, to give a talk on the meaning of mercy in St Luke's Gospel. It will take place in the Parish Social Services Centre on Monday 7 March at 7.30pm.

Pope Francis wants us to engage in a fresh way with the theme of mercy. I am delighted that Fr O'Gorman will join us and bring alive the beautiful examples of mercy in the Gospel".
