Columban 1400

Columban was the most outstanding of the Irish monks who left this country to 'be a pilgrim for Christ' in mainland Europe. Born on the Wexford/Carlow border, near to Mount Leinster it is thought he was an only child. His parents were of high social status though they did not belong to the nobility. His mother had a vision a few days before his birth that her son would be a great light to the world. As an adolescent he felt called to become a monk. In spite of his mother's strenuous objections he studied first at Cleenish Island on Lough Erne (near Enniskillen) and later at the great monastery of Bangor on Belfast Lough, founded by St Comgall who was a student of St Finian of Clonard.
